The following provisions govern the Agreement referenced above:

Contractor agrees, as an independent contractor, to undertake the work described in the Agreement in a neat and professional manner reasonably acceptable to the District, in accordance with industry standards, and in accordance with all applicable federal, state, and local laws, regulations, and ordinances.
- b. Contractor shall use reasonable care in performing the services and shall be responsible for any harm of any kind to persons or property resulting from Contractor's actions or inactions.
- c. The Contractor warrants to the District that all materials furnished under the Agreement shall be new, and that all services and materials shall be of good quality, free from faults and defects, and will conform to the standards and practices for projects of similar design and complexity in an expeditious and economical manner consistent with the best interest of the District. The Contractor hereby warrants any materials, labor, and services for a period of one (1) year after acceptance by the District or longer as required under Florida law. Contractor shall replace or repair warranted items to the District's satisfaction and in the District's discretion. Neither final acceptance of the work, nor final payment therefore, nor any provision of the Agreement shall relieve Contractor of responsibility for defective or deficient materials or work. If any of the materials or work are found to be defective, deficient or not in accordance with the Agreement, Contractor shall correct, remove and replace it promptly after receipt of a written notice from the District and correct and pay for any other damage resulting therefrom to District property or the property of landowner's within the District.
- d. All permits or licenses necessary for the Contractor to perform under the Agreement shall be obtained and paid for by the Contractor.
- e. Contractor shall complete the work described in the Agreement within thirty (30) days following the date of full execution of this Addendum.

3. Insurance.

- a. The Contractor, and any subcontractor performing the work described in the Agreement, shall maintain throughout the term of the Agreement the following insurance:
 - i. Workers' Compensation Insurance in accordance with the laws of the State of Florida.

- ii. Commercial General Liability Insurance covering the Contractor's legal liability for bodily injuries, with limits of not less than \$1,000,000 combined single limit bodily injury and property damage liability, including Independent Contractors Coverage for bodily injury and property damage in connection with subcontractors' operation.
- iii. Automobile Liability Insurance for bodily injuries in limits of not less than \$1,000,000 combined single limit bodily injury and for property damage, providing coverage for any accident arising out of or resulting from the operation, maintenance, or use by the Contractor of any owned, non-owned, or hired automobiles, trailers, or other equipment required to be licensed.
- b. The District, its staff, consultants, agents, and supervisors shall be named as additional insureds and certificate holders on the above listed policies, except Workers' Compensation Insurance. All above-referenced insurance policies shall be considered primary and non-contributory with respect to the additional insureds, and all required insurance policies shall be endorsed to provide for a waiver of underwriter's rights of subrogation in favor of the additional insureds. The Contractor shall furnish the District with the Certificate of Insurance evidencing compliance with this requirement. No certificate shall be acceptable to the District unless it provides that any change or termination within the policy periods of the insurance coverage, as certified, shall not be effective within thirty (30) days of prior written notice to the District. Insurance coverage shall be from a reputable insurance carrier, licensed to conduct business in the State of Florida.
- c. If the Contractor fails to have secured and maintained the required insurance, the District has the right (without any obligation to do so, however), to secure such required insurance in which event, the Contractor shall pay the cost for that required insurance and shall furnish, upon demand, all information that may be required in connection with the District's obtaining the required insurance.
- 4. Compensation. In exchange for completing the work, and upon final completion and approval by the District of the work, the District agrees to pay the Contractor a total amount of Five Thousand Eight Hundred Eighty-Two Dollars and Zero Cents (\$5,800.00). This compensation includes all parts, materials, and labor necessary to complete the work as described in the Agreement and this Addendum. Compensation under the Agreement shall be paid by the District to Contractor in accordance with the Local Government Prompt Payment Act, as set forth in sections 218.70 et seq. of the Florida Statutes.
- 5. <u>Indemnification</u>. Contractor shall defend, indemnify and hold harmless the District, and the District's officers, staff, representatives, and agents, from any and all liabilities, damages, claims, losses, costs, or harm of any kind, including, but not limited to, reasonable attorney's fees, to the extent caused by any acts or omissions of the indemnifying party and persons employed or utilized by the indemnifying party in the performance of the Agreement. The obligations under this paragraph shall be limited to no more than \$1,000,000.00, which amount Contractor agrees bears a reasonable commercial relationship to the Agreement. Nothing in this Section is intended to waive or alter any other remedies that the District may have as against the Contractor.
- 6. <u>Limitations on Governmental Liability</u>. Contractor further agrees that nothing in the Agreement between the parties shall constitute or be construed as a waiver of the District's limitations on liability contained in section 768.28, *Florida Statutes*, or other statute.

- 7. Termination. The agreement may be terminated immediately by the District for cause, or upon thirty (30) days' written notice by either party for any or no reason, provided however that any termination by the Contractor shall only be effective after providing the District with a reasonable opportunity to cure any default. Contractor shall not be entitled to lost profits or any other damages of any kind resulting from any termination by the District, provided however that Contractor shall be entitled to payment for any work provided through the effective date of termination, subject to any offsets.
- 8. Public Records. The Contractor understands and agrees that all documents of any kind provided to the District in connection with the Agreement may be public records, and, accordingly, the Contractor agrees to comply with all applicable provisions of Florida law in handling such records, including but not limited to Section 119.0701, Florida Statutes. Contractor acknowledges that the designated public records custodian for the District is Wrathell, Hunt and Associates, LLC ("Public Records Custodian"). Among other requirements and to the extent applicable by law, the Contractor shall 1) keep and maintain public records required by the District to perform the service; 2) upon request by the Public Records Custodian, provide the District with the requested public records or allow the records to be inspected or copied within a reasonable time period at a cost that does not exceed the cost provided in Chapter 119, Florida Statutes; 3) ensure that public records which are exempt or confidential, and exempt from public records disclosure requirements, are not disclosed except as authorized by law for the duration of the Agreement's term and following the contract term if the Contractor does not transfer the records to the Public Records Custodian of the District; and 4) upon completion of the contract, transfer to the District, at no cost, all public records in Contractor's possession or, alternatively, keep, maintain and meet all applicable requirements for retaining public records pursuant to Florida laws. When such public records are transferred by the Contractor, the Contractor shall destroy any duplicate public records that are exempt or confidential and exempt from public records disclosure requirements. All records stored electronically must be provided to the District in a format that is compatible with Microsoft Word or Adobe PDF formats.

IF CONTRACTOR HAS QUESTIONS REGARDING THE APPLICATION OF CHAPTER 119, FLORIDA STATUTES, TO THE CONTRACTOR'S DUTY TO PROVIDE PUBLIC RECORDS RELATING TO THIS CONTRACT, CONTACT THE CUSTODIAN OF PUBLIC RECORDS AT (877) 276-0889, INFO@SILVERADOCDD.ORG, OR 2300 GLADES ROAD, SUITE 410W, BOCA RATON, FLORIDA 33431.

- 9. <u>Assignment</u>. Neither the District nor the Contractor may assign the Agreement or any monies to become due hereunder without the prior written approval of the other.
- 10. <u>Liens and Claims</u>. Notwithstanding any other language in the Agreement, the parties agree that lien rights are not available under Florida law because the District is a governmental entity. That said, the District represents that it has sufficient funds on hand to pay any amounts due pursuant to the terms of the Agreement and this Addendum.
- 11. <u>Controlling Law and Venue</u>. In the event that either party is required to enforce the Agreement, as amended by this Addendum, by court proceedings or otherwise, then the parties agree that the prevailing party shall be entitled to recover from the other all fees and costs incurred, including

reasonable attorneys' fees and costs for trial, alternative dispute resolution, or appellate proceedings. The Agreement, as amended, and the provisions contained in the Agreement and this Addendum shall be construed, interpreted, and controlled according to the laws of the State of Florida. Venue for any legal actions regarding the Agreement or this Addendum shall be Pasco County, Florida.

- 12. <u>E-Verify</u>. The Contractor shall comply with and perform all applicable provisions of section 448.095, *Florida Statutes*. Accordingly, to the extent required by Florida Statute, Contractor shall register with and use the United States Department of Homeland Security's E-Verify system to verify the work authorization status of all newly hired employees. The District may terminate the Agreement immediately for cause if there is a good faith belief that the Contractor has knowingly violated section 448.091, *Florida Statutes*. By entering into the Agreement, the Contractor represents that no public employer has terminated a contract with the Contractor under section 448.095(5)(c), *Florida Statutes*, within the year immediately preceding the date of the Agreement.
- 13. <u>Scrutinized Companies Statement</u>. In accordance with section 287.135, *Florida Statutes*, Contractor represents that in entering into the Agreement, neither it nor any of its officers, directors, executives, partners, shareholders, members, or agents is on the Scrutinized Companies with Activities in Sudan List, the Scrutinized Companies with Activities in the Iran Terrorism Sectors List, or the Scrutinized Companies that Boycott Israel List created pursuant to sections 215.4725 and 215.473, *Florida Statutes*, and in the event such status changes, Contractor shall immediately notify the District. If Contractor is found to have submitted a false statement, has been placed on the Scrutinized Companies with Activities in Sudan List, the Scrutinized Companies with Activities in the Iran Terrorism Sectors List, or has been engaged in business operations in Cuba or Syria, or is now or in the future on the Scrutinized Companies that Boycott Israel List, or engaged in a boycott of Israel, the District may immediately terminate the Agreement.
- 14. <u>Anti-Human Trafficking Requirements</u>. Contractor certifies, by acceptance of the Agreement, that neither it nor its principals utilize coercion for labor or services as defined in section 787.06, *Florida Statutes*. Contractor affirms that it previously executed an affidavit in compliance with section 787.06(13), *Florida Statutes*.
- 15. <u>Addendum Controls</u>. The Agreement, as amended by this Addendum, shall constitute the final and complete expression of the agreement between the parties relating to the subject matter of the Agreement. To the extent any of the provisions of this Addendum are in conflict with the provisions of the Agreement, this Addendum controls.

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF SILVERADO COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT AMENDING THE FISCAL YEAR 2025 GENERAL BUDGET; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the Silverado Community Development District ("District") is a local unit of special-purpose government created and existing pursuant to Chapter 190, Florida Statutes, being situated entirely within the City of Zephyrhills, Pasco County, Florida; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of the District ("Board") previously adopted a final General Fund Budget ("Budget") for the Fiscal Year beginning October 1, 2024, and ending September 30, 2025 ("Fiscal Year 2025"); and

WHEREAS, the Board desires to amend the Fiscal Year 2025 Budget to reflect changes to budgeted revenues and expenses approved during Fiscal Year 2025; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Chapters 189 and 190, Florida Statutes, the Board is authorized to amend the Fiscal Year 2025 Budget within sixty (60) days following the end of the Fiscal Year 2025; and

WHEREAS, the Board finds that it is in the best interest of the District and its landowners to amend the Fiscal Year 2025 Budget to reflect the actual appropriations.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF SILVERADO COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT:

SECTION 1. BUDGET AMENDMENT.

- **a.** The Board has reviewed the proposed amended Budget, copies of which are on file with the office of the District Manager and at the District's Records Office, and hereby approves certain amendments thereto, as shown in Section 2 below.
- b. The amended Budget attached hereto as **Exhibit A** and incorporated herein by reference as further amended by the Board is hereby adopted in accordance with the provisions of sections 190.008(2)(a) and 189.016(6), *Florida Statutes*; provided, however, that the comparative figures contained in the amended Budget as adopted by the Board (together, "**Adopted Annual Budget**") may be further revised as deemed necessary by the District Manager to further reflect actual revenues and expenditures for Fiscal Year 2025.
- **c.** The Adopted Annual Budget shall be maintained in the office of the District Manager and the District Records Office and identified as "The Adopted Budget for Silverado

Community Development District for the Fiscal Year Ending September 30, 2025, as amended and adopted by the Board of Supervisors effective October 20, 2025."

SECTION 2. APPROPRIATIONS. There is hereby appropriated out of the revenues of the District, the fiscal year beginning October 1, 2024, and ending September 30, 2025, the sums set forth below, to be raised by special assessments or otherwise, which sums are deemed by the Board of Supervisors to be necessary to defray all expenditures of the District during said budget year, to be divided and appropriated in the following fashion:

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Ms. Sanchez stated that this is a workshop wherein various CDD items and issues will be discussed; therefore, no action will be taken. Any action or votes that need to be taken will be done in the regular meeting immediately after the workshop.

Mr. Alexander thanked everyone in attendance and stated it is important that residents understand the difference between the responsibilities of the CDD and the HOA. The CDD is responsible for the landscaping, roads, front entrance lights, community amenities and other items along with payment for the bonds that funded the public infrastructure; the assessments are on their annual tax bill. He and Mr. Gonzalez serve on both the CDD and HOA Boards. Ms. Lynch, who is attending via telephone, is the Operations Manager for the HOA and is in charge of events, regulating architectural requests, and issuing citations for violations regarding lawn maintenance and visible garbage bins. Florida has changed the laws for HOAs and the Silverado HOA abides by those laws. Ms. Hammock stated anything dealing with private property is an HOA matter and anything involving the common areas is a CDD matter.

Ms. Sanchez introduced Jerry Edwards and stated both Ms. Lynch and Mr. Edwards work for Kai Management but serve in different roles. Ms. Lynch manages the HOA operations and Mr. Edwards manages the CDD operations. A general e-blast was recently sent alerting residents about Kai Management and announcing Mr. Edwards, who is the point of contact with the CDD's vendors.

Mr. Gonzalez arrived at the meeting at 5:23 p.m.

Mr. Alexander recapped that he is the President of the HOA, Mr. Gonzalez is the Vice President, Beatrice is the Secretary/Treasurer and Ms. Lynch is the point of contact for HOA violations and Architectural Review Committee (ARC) matters. This is an opportunity for the Board to listen to what residents have to say and try to improve and enhance the CDD, going forward.

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THIRD ORDER OF BUSINESS

Ms. Sanchez explained the protocols for public comment.

Resident Michelle Valli asked if the CDD or the City of Zephyrhills is responsible for repairing a fence near the conservation area, which was damaged by a past hurricane. She

asked if "No fishing" signage can be installed near her home to deter fishing in the lake, as she believes it is private property. Regarding the fence, Ms. Hammock stated it is County property at a County facility and the CDD has no legal authority to access County property to repair a fence that it does not own. The Developer previously installed a PVC fence around that area; however, the County is willing to enter into a license and maintenance agreement with the CDD to authorize the CDD to re-install and maintain the fence, if the Board is amenable. Ms. Hammock voiced her plan to present this item as part of her Staff Report during the Regular meeting and, if the Board votes in favor, Staff will get the paperwork in place with the County by the next Board meeting. Regarding signage, it was noted that fishing is allowed in the ponds in the CDD. However, if individuals are walking through private property to access those areas, homeowners should call the Zephyrhills Police to report trespassers. Ms. Sanchez stated the Rules were updated in April of this year, with regard to fishing. The Rules are on the CDD website.

Resident Ken Kitlas suggested that the damaged fence on Coble Bliss be replaced with a chain link fence, which can withstand storms and bring about cost savings.

Resident Debbie Kitlas asked when area trees damaged by a previous hurricane will be taken care of. Mr. Alexander stated the trees will be addressed during the CDD meeting being held after this workshop. Mr. Chamoff stated there was a significant delay in resolving the tree issues specifically because the previous landscaper was not a good fit for the CDD and the focus was on transitioning away from Juniper and finding a new landscaper. The new landscape vendor will attend the regular meeting, report his findings and present a plan of action.

Resident Ron Manzione stated his backyard abuts a pond and there is a retention pond that is currently filled with grass. He stated, although the area is being mowed, he thinks the retention pond is not adequately maintained and asked who is responsible for maintaining it. Mr. Alexander stated that he took several photographs and emailed them to District Staff. Mr. Edwards is aware of the mowing issues in that area and the situation is being addressed.

Discussion ensued regarding why the retention pond area has not been mowed consistently, which entity is responsible for maintaining the median on Cobble Bliss and Kai Management's responsiveness.

Resident Takiyah Graham stated she recently received a violation for the trash bins that were left out while she was on vacation. She asked why she was not notified of the violation via email. She stated she travels often and is uncomfortable giving neighbors her keys and asking them to put away her trash bins.

Mr. Alexander stated residents who are going away on vacation should inform Ms. Lynch and kindly ask their neighbors to put/move emptied trash bins away from the sidewalk and near their garage. Ms. Lynch stated residents who receive a violation and need additional time to pay should email her at silverado@kai.com and they will be granted an extension; this way it is noted on their account and stops the process from going forward. Ms. Lynch will follow up with Ms. Graham regarding the violation.

A resident asked about the change in the meeting venue and stated that she is working on purchasing sod to avoid receiving an HOA violation for her unkept lawn.

Ms. Hammock stated residents can access accurate CDD Board meeting information on the CDD website silveradocdd.org. Facebook is not an official resource and residents with questions or concerns should contact Ms. Sanchez or Kai Management.

Discussion ensued regarding the CDD website, Facebook posts, occasional meeting cancellations due to a lack of quorum and how best to obtain directions to the Train Depot location.
